FOR YOU TO THINK ABOUT...

In the November 1993 issue of The American Organist president James C. Moeser writes: "It is interesting to watch the phenomenon of dues renewal take place from the national perspective of headquarters. The money trickles in as individual chapters get geared up again every fall. This rebirth of activity varies in speed and intensity from chapter to chapter, city to city, depending upon the quality of volunteer leadership in place at the time. In many of our chapters, a member could fall by the wayside and never be noticed.

"... The question becomes then, what changes should we make to maximize the retention of the members we

already have?

"I believe that the answer is in the national collection of dues. Rather than relying on local treasurer to remind our members to renew each year. why not leave this task to a computer at headquarters?..our chapters would be relieved of the burden of collecting renewals and able to concentrate their efforts on recruiting new members....Why not allow our members to subscribe for up to three years at one time. Both chapters and the national organization would have the advantage of this up-front payment, and individuals could lock in dues for up to three years at a time, eliminating the effects of increases that are now indexed to inflation..."

What do you think? Mr. Moeser invites both responses and additional suggestions...the editor
