"The Christmas Oratorio by J. S. Bach will be presented at the close of the Christmas Season on Sunday, January 6, 1985, at Nativity Catholic Church in Fargo at 7:30 p.m. The concert, sponsored by the American Guild of Organists, will feature a 100-voice choir of singers from 25 area church choirs, soloists, an orchestra, and organ. Sung in English, the oratorio is a musical setting of the Christmas story as recorded in Luke. An offering will be received to help defray expenses of the concert."
