Board Meeting Notes



The following board members were present at the AGO board meeting on Thursday, July 16 at noon at Boulger Funeral Home in Fargo. Michael Olson, Erich Knapp, Anna Goodin-Hayes, Peggy Johnson, and Bill Tweten.

Peggy and Michael discussed the Wichita regional AGO convention. Peggy brought her book to show the rest of the board members—the convention book was very nice. The attendance at the convention was about 125—not what the committee had hoped for but, in spite of the economy and such, it was a pretty good showing. All ten states in our region WERE represented at the convention (I happened to be the only attendee from North Dakota...)

Peggy called the meeting to order at 12:15 after a delicious potluck lunch was enjoyed by all.

The secretary's report from the May board meeting (as there was no June board meeting) was approved as submitted.

Since there is not a treasurer at the present time, there was no treasurer's report.

Peggy mailed surveys to each chapter member (2008-2009) to provide feedback on chapter programs and other issues. NINE surveys were returned to Peggy, and she shared the results of those surveys. (I do not have the results to share with others at this time, but the results were discussed at the board meeting by Peggy.)

Peggy discussed having a student representative (probably a student from Concordia) on the board for a one-year term. She will discuss this with Peter Nygaard to find a possible person to serve.

Programs were discussed for the 2009-2010 season. There will be a program at Gethsemane Cathedral on Sunday afternoon, September 20 at 4:00. This will be a review of the Wichita regional convention, as well as a music exchange (which has been quite successful in the past). Peggy also mentioned that we might bring CDs that we no longer listen to (or possibly have never listened to) and could sell those to other chapter members at a nominal charge -- perhaps even three dollars - and use the proceeds from the CD sale to give some money to the AGO Annual Fund.

Kim Kasling from St. John's University will present an organ recital at First Lutheran Church on Friday evening, October 30 at 8.00 p.m. He will also give a masterclass on Saturday morning, October 31 from 10:00 to noon, also at First Lutheran.

The Christmas Carol Sing-A-Long was discussed. It was decided that, at least for the current season, that we not have this event but that we promote events of chapter members during the holiday season.

Sunday, March 21, 2010 "just happens" to be Bach's 225th birthday. We have discussed having a progressive Bach Fest—there might be chamber music at one church, choral music at another church, organ music at another church. The discussion is just beginning concerning this event.

We discussed the possibility of working with Communiversity on possibly having a class on Johann Sebastian Bach and his music, especially since 2010 will be a big anniversary year. Perhaps it is too late already to get on the February 2010 Communiversity course list, but we'll check it out.

Other topics that were discussed include the following:

LPM—Leadership for Parish Musicians (a program for parish musicians predominantly in smaller churches)
Certification—AGO certification is available on several levels, perhaps the Service Playing exam and the Colleague (CAGO) exam would benefit the most people
POE (Pipe Organ Encounter) or Pedals, Pipes, and Pizza (or possibly both events) for younger folk

We also discussed having a post-Easter brunch on Sunday, April 4 and/or a post-Pentecost brunch on Sunday, May 16 to discuss the morning's worship (good things, bad things, things we would have done differently, ideas from other colleagues, and such).

The next board meeting will be Thursday, August 20 at noon at Boulger Funeral Home.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:20 pm.

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




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
