ORGAN DEMONSTRATION TOUR SET FOR MAY 17

The AGO membership, and the public, will have an opportunity on May 17th to hear pipe organ demonstrations of three instruments in our area of western Minnesota.

At 3:15 p.m. the group will gather at historic Eksjo Lutheran Church (seven miles east of Hawley on Highway 10) to hear and "try out" the 12 rank Reuter pipe organ. The Eksjo congregation, formed in 1871 and perhaps the oldest in our area, installed the Reuter organ in 1950 with several recent additions by the Johnson Organ Co. Mercedes Roos is organist. Elva Bergseid, guild member serving as Rollag Lutheran Church organist, has volunteered to provide refreshments at Eksjo.

The next stop on the tour will be at Hawley Lutheran Church where a modern structure houses a 10 year old Johnson pipe organ of 20 ranks.

Continuing westward, the group will visit Dilworth Lutheran Church where the Johnson Organ Co. has in recent months enlarged the tracker (mechanical action) instrument, originally installed a few years ago. Susan Knorr is organist.

Hurry up - we can't be late!

Members are encouraged to bring music on the tour, as opportunities will be available at each location to sample the instruments' resources. Because this is a public event, members of the chapter should issue as many personal invitations as possible.

The workshop will be conducted by **Walter Ehret**. The Dean of American choral music, Mr. Ehret has more than 2000 octavos, collections, and teaching folios to his credit. His clinics are always exciting and informative. You will enjoy his upbeat, positive, and congenial manner.

Over 100 choral selections from some 50 publishers will be presented. The set will be extremely diverse in terms of historical periods, styles, composers, voicings, levels of difficulty, and calendar year representation.

There is no charge to you. All music (over \$100.00 worth) will be given **free of charge** to those attending the clinic. You may bring additional choir members to the workshop.

Directions: Messiah Lutheran is across the street from the V.A. Hospital in north Fargo. Arriving from Highways 10, 75, or I-94, turn north at the intersection of NP/Center Avenue or Main Avenue and 2nd Street North in Fargo. Turn east at 12th Avenue, and continue to the intersection with Elm Street where you turn north. Arriving from I-29, take the 19th Avenue exit. Continue on 19th Avenue until the intersection with Elm Street where you turn north. There is ample parking around the church. The church is fully accessible.
