



HYMN FESTIVAL

Our 8th Annual Hymn Festival, Sunday, October 11, Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd, Moorhead at 7 PM features David M. Cherwien, full-time Director of Music at St. Luke's Lutheran Church, Park Ridge, IL. He will conduct the premiere performance of his setting of "Duke Street," for audience, mixed choir, organ, brass & percussion. This music was commissioned by us especially for this hymn festival.

Cherwien has distinguished among young American organists by his play an entire service, including prelude, postlude, liturgy & hymns. with very little reference to printed music. European tradition of church organists, going back to the time of J.S. Bach and before, he composes or improvises much of the music he plays in a worship The music is based on the lessons and liturgy appointed for the day and even on the texts of the hymns He will demonstrate this to be sung. "lost art" as he accompanies audience and choirs at the hymn festival.

native of Minneapolis. earned a Bachelor of Music degree in organ performance and music education at Augsburg College where he studied Stephen Gabrielson organ with choral conducting with Leland Sateren. specialized liturgical l n improvisation during two years of study Berliner Kirchenmusikschule (Berlin Church Music School) in West Berlin. There he studied improvisation Renate Zimmermann. literature with Karl Hochreither, and composition with the late

Pepping. He completed additional organ study with Christian Baude in Aix-en-Provence, France, and with Paul Manz, Heinrich Fleischer, and Earl Barr in this country. He has published five volumes of hymn tune variations for organ as well as choral works. From 1981 until his recent appointment in suburban Chicago, he served as Director of Music at First Lutheran Church of Richmond Beach, Seattle.

As guest conductor of this hymn festival, Mr. Cherwien has chosen hymns that illustrate the similiarities between a single day, from morning to night, to spiritual life from birth to death. 20 church choirs, directed by our members, have been invited to attend a rehearsal prior to the festival. This combined choir will lead the audience in singing the hymns at the festival.

A complimentary ticket is enclosed for your use. Additional tickets are available at music and religious bookstores, all Hornbacher's stores and at the door.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MINUTES: 9-20-87 1st United Methodist Church, Fargo

OLD BUSINESS: The minutes from the July meeting were read. Motion was made to approve them as read; motion was seconded and passed. Phil presented the finalized version of the 1987-88 budget as put together by the Executive Committee.

NEW BUSINESS: The Minnesota Citizens for the Arts, a political action group for the arts in Minnesota, has sent our chapter a letter inviting us to join their organization. Phil moved that we join; motion was seconded & passed. The cost of joining is \$25/member group. The consensus was that the political advocacy benefits could far outweigh the cost, especially since we cannot afford much political representation on our own.

Regarding the subject of a fund drive, Rod suggested that we should conduct one similar to last year's. It would involve a bulk mailing. Jack pointed out that there is no Coordinated Arts Fund drive this year. Dorothy made a motion to authorize the Budget & Finance Committee to carry on a general Fund Drive. Motion was seconded & passed.

Concerns were expressed regarding membership information, especially the potential loss of information because it is spread around so many people. Means of preventing loss or confusion of this information was that forms received by the Treasurer be forwarded to Jack (database) then to the Yearbook Editor, next to the Newsletter Editor & then back to the Treasurer for his records. Also, Brad asked on behalf of the Membership Committee that a current list of paid & non-paid members be forwarded to him as soon as possible.

Pat informed the Committee that the Recital Committee, chaired by Peter Nygaard, has formed & begun work towards finding a recitalist for Fall 1988. Rod mentioned the idea of having this committee choose the recitalist, but have the general membership vote on the final selection. Pat will take that idea to the Recital Committee.

Discussion was held as to where to have "Church Music Bonanza III" next June. Possible church & college sites, logistics & transportation were discussed at length. Rod will pursue the securing of a location & would welcome any ideas from the Committee.

The meeting was adjourned.

CENTENNIAL HYMN COMPETITION

The Centennial Liturgy Committee of the Catholic Diocese of Fargo has announced a hymn tune competition in celebration of its centennial year in 1989.

The text of the 4-verse hymn has been written by Rev. Robert W. Hovda, a retired priest of the diocese who is well-known as a liturgical author. He has written numerous articles & books on liturgy including "Dry Bones," "Strong, Loving & Wise," & "There are Different Ministries." In 1982 he was the recipient of the Berakah Award, an honor given by the North American Academy of Liturgy for his work in liturgical reform.

The setting should be in 4 parts & set for either piano or organ & suitable for arrangements for contemporary music groups & instrumental combinations such as brass.


