POOR INSTRUMENTS DRIVE AWAY ORGAN-ISTS

Earlier this summer I ran into a vacationing pasto friend at Zion Lutheran church on Franklin Lake where we worship in the summer. Out of habit, I asked him what kind of organ they had at his new parish. His answer was a donated home spinet organ and that the organist wasn't very good. I then asked him how he expects to get a good organist playing an organ made for the home entertainment market?

He didn't have an answer but he seemed more disappointed in the organist than the organ. This is symptomatic of churches that do not take their musicians seriously. There are too many pastors and church music people who think that the organ is a necessary evil and downplay it. As long as it makes an organ-like sound it is OK. Well folks, it is not OK! Congregations are building very expensive churches without giving much thought to the organ and many with decrepit instruments are simply bringing it over to the new building with the lame excuse that they couldn't afford to fit a new organ into the building fund. Then they complain and stew over the fact that no one wants the job of organist. Inferior instruments will not only not inspire young people to study organ but will drive them away in droves.

If you are playing a poor instrument and are satisfied with your position, replacing you when you want to move or retire will be next to impossible. Church musicians need to stand up and be heard and to campaign for quality organs which will then lead to not only getting those younger ones interested in the organ but will make it easier to find new organists when needed.

Hopefully someday we will see the end to organs being accepted for donation by our churches which are nearly worn out and/or organs with undersized keyboards and pedal boards.
