OLD BUSINESS: The effectiveness of the "flow of information" (as established at the September meeting) was discussed. The consensus was that it is working well, especially in determining who is not a member.

It was decided that Rod should consult again with Carolyn Hensrud (State Chairperson) & the Bismarck Chapter before taking any further action on this.

After a festive evening meal, we returned to Moorhead, tired & exhilerated.

October also saw the completion of our fall round of organ demonstrations. Peter Nygaard & Judy Sanders provided well-received, hands-on commentaries about the instruments at their respective churches. The series will resume in the spring & will include children from each of the Moorhead public elementary schools.

Finally, Marge Possehl, Jill Post & Jack Close are to be congratulated on their hymn festival weekend with David Cherwien. Opening with an "Autograph Party" at Jill's home on Friday evening, & continuing with a very helpful introduction to organ improvisation on Saturday morning, the weekend concluded with another successful hymn festival at the Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd. Mr. Cherwien's hymn concertato on "Duke Street" was premiered at that time.

"The French Connection," a recital of 19th-century & 20th-century French Music was well-attended & marked: 1)the anniversaries of the births & deaths of several of the composers included on the program, 2)National Arts Week, & 3) the 30th anniversary of the installation of the Holtkamp organ at Trinity, Moorhead.

Thanks are extended to all who contributed their time, talents & imaginations to these events.

We now look for a somewhat more tranquil, but no less interesting, winter.

The January program of the Red River Valley Chapter of the American Guild of Organists will center on the Service of Evensong or Evening Vespers. Scheduled for January 17, 1988, at 4 PM, the program will expose participants to the history & worship significance of Evensong or Evening Vespers in various religious denominations, i.e. Lutheran, Anglican, Roman Catholic & reformed denominations, & will allow participants to experience worship through one form of a Service of Evensong, that found in the Lutheran Book of Worship. This program will be hosted at Dilworth Lutheran Church.

Conducting the service will be the Reverend Hal A. Andersen. Rebecca Te Velde & Bryan Dockter will provide organ music for the service. Members of the Dilworth Lutheran Church Senior Choir will participate in leading the program. AGO members are invited to come at 2:30 PM & participate in the choir which will lead the liturgical responses & perform the following numbers: "Oh, How Beautiful the Sky" (P.J. Christiansen), & "Evening Prayer" from Oramus-Set I (C. Schalk). The hymns included in the service are "All Praise to Thee, My God, This Night" (Tallis' Canon), "Oh, Gladsome Light" (Elizabeth) & "Now the Day Is Over" (Merrial).
