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#### FROM THE PRESS RELEASE

Over the years, many people have said, "I wish I could sing in a large choir with an orchestra," or "I've always wanted to sing in a full production of Handel's Messiah." Once again, the opportunity is here and it will take a very limited time commitment. The American Guild of Organists and the First Presbyterian Church Concert Series proudly present the second annual Fargo-Moorhead Community Messiah Sing-Along.

Last year, more than 200 singers participated in the event, and many enthusiastic comments were made about the event. Some of the participants vowed to bring their whole church choir to participate, and others stated that this was a tradition that they would love to follow every Christmas season.

This event will be patterned after last year's performance and similar events in major cities around the country. Orchestra members and soloists will rehearse in advance of the event, then singer participants arrive one hour before the event to rehearse the difficult sections of music. Then, at the appointed hour, the performance begins. Any individual may sing in this performance regardless of musical skill level or background, and no advance preparation is necessary. A section of the performance area will be set aside for those persons who do not wish to sing.

The organizers have arranged to hire the finest orchestra players in the area, along with the most highly recognized regional singers as soloists, and invite the community to serve as the chorus for a large scale and high quality performance of Handel's oratorio masterpiece. The soloists are among the most highly trained and respected area opera singers: Peter Halverson, Lucy Thrasher, David Hamilton.

Gary Thrasher, Director of Music at First Presbyterian, will once again be the director of the Sing-Along.

The university has a 3 manual, 29 rank Moller instrument, purchased in 1938 as a used organ, and tonally updated by Johnson in 1964. The organ was dedicated to the memory of Fanny Amidon, who served as the college's first dean of fine arts.

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# NEWS FROM M P R "In the Shadow of Your Wings" Concordia College Christmas Concert

Minnesota Public Radio, KCCM 91.1 FM, will broadcast the 1995 Concordia College Christmas Concert on Thursday, December 14th, at 7:00 P.M. Featured ensembles will include the Concordia Concert Choir, under the direction of Rene Clausen; The Concordia Chapel Choir, Freshman Choir, and the Bel Canto Choir, directed by Paul Nesheim; The Concordia College Orchestra, conducted by Bruce Houglum; and Tintinnabula, a handbell choir, conducted by June Boyd. Approximately 400 musicians will take part in the concert, which has become a celebrated, long-standing tradition at Concordia College.

This year's concert theme, "In the Shadow of Your Wings," is taken from Psalm 17, and the music and mural art backdrop illustrate the Christmas story in relation to creation.




