November 19, 1989 Trinity Lutheran Church Moorhead, Minnesota

Dean George French called the meeting to order and introduced Stephen Gabrielson, guest organist for the Hymn Festival. He commented on the dearth of organ students, nationwide. No concrete solutions were offered.

A location is needed for the "After Christmas" party. No firm offers to host it were made.

There was a lengthy discussion about the status of the newsletter, yearbook, and committee structure, leading finally to a motion by Rod Rothlisberger, seconded by Marlowe Kulish, to retain said items as in the past. Marlowe Kulish offered to draft a sign-up sheet (found in the December Newsletter) for members to respond to committee needs.

It was announced that Ruth Fossum has a children's choir rehearsing weekly at Grace Lutheran Church. Guild members were invited to visit rehearsals. Call Ruth for details. No sponsorship of this group by the Guild was offered at this time. Plans are under way for the Childrens Choir Festival, March 18, Chairman Jack Close reported.

Dean George was asked by the group to have treasurer, Lloyd Collins, provide copies of the treasurer's report and budget.

The nominating committee will be elected in January with a slate of candidates presented in February and voting in March.

Subdean, Brad Steen, will assume the Dean position in March while George is out of the area.

CHILDRENS CHOIR FESTIVAL

The Childrens Choir Festival will be held on Sunday, March 18, 1990 at Olivet Lutheran Church in Fargo at 4:00 p.m. The Festival Choir will rehearse at 2:00 p.m. that day.

The theme for this year's Festival is "Stories of Jesus". Anthems, choruses, and hymns have been selected to tell the stories of Jesus' birth, life, and triumph over death. Readings from the four Gospels, adapted for children, will be included in the program. Instrumental ensembles, vocal solos, and hymns for choirs and audience will also be featured in the Festival Concert.

Invitations to church choirs with singers from grades 1 through 6 are being mailed during the week of December 15. We had over 200 choristers in our 1988 Festival Choir, and we expect that many or more at our 1990 Festival.

One of the first tasks of the committee was to select music for this year's festival. Committee members were asked to suggest some of their most successful and popular anthems and choruses. Their suggestions were truly exciting--some familiar favorites, some recent publications. We know that every piece selected for the Festival concert is a winner. Many of the selections are appropriate for Lent, Palm Sunday, Easter, and Pentecost.

Childrens Choir Festival activities begin with a one-hour Director Workshop Sunday, January 7 at 3:30 p.m. in Kresge Lounge in the Hvidsten Hall of Music at Concordia College. At this workshop, we will read through all the Festival Music, provide information about buying it, and give suggestions for preparing and performing the music. Tapes of the music, for use in preparing the choristers, will also be offered at this workshop.

All chapter members are urged to begin to encourage participation in the Childrens Choir Festival by choristers in their own parishes. While the committee is able to announce the Festival and invite choirs through the mail, your personal invitation to directors in your church is the most effective way we have of insuring both an artistic and financially successful project.


