After an absence of nearly twenty years, Dr. Skroch saw the need to broaden the keyboard offerings. She has hired Red River Valley Chapter member Michael Olson, organist at First Lutheran in Fargo, to teach one half-day per week. Six students have registered for the fall semester in organ, and Michael is busily into the schedule. MORE RECITALS FOR OCTOBER 17!!

7:00 p.m. is the time for the dedication of a new Allen organ at Our Savior's Lutheran church in Veblen, SD. Recitalist is Mary Maynard, chapter member and organist at Our Savior's in Moorhead.

Included in the program will be Cor Kee's "Ein Feste Burg", "Finale from Symphony No. 1" by Vierne, Bach's "6th Organ Sonata", and modern arrangements of various hymn tunes.

Mary is a 1982 graduate of Concordia College in Moorhead, where she studied organ with Ruth Berge. More recently she has studied with Peter Nygaard and Joan Bystol. In addition to her organ work, Mary is a private piano teacher in Fargo.

Tom Hanson will be the featured organist at a 4 p.m recital on a small 8-rank Moller organ restored by Gould Co. of Minneapolis.

St. James Episcopal Church, North Court & Lakeside Drive, Fergus Falls, MN, plans an operhouse from 3 - 5 p.m. which includes High Anglica Tea at 3 p.m. and the recital at 4. The festivities to celebrate restoration of several things at church.

Hanson is organist at Augustana Lutheran Chur in Fergus Falls. His program will include comp tions by Mendelsohn, Bach and Ralph von William For more information, call Tom at 218-736-3075. ORGAN NEWS....The St. John Lutheran Church in south Fargo now has a new Scharf Mixture of two ranks in the Swell. This stop was prepared for when the organ was built in 1984. The organ at that time had ten ranks and was moved to the new sanctuary in 1987.

The 4 rank unit organ at Hamar Lutheran Church in Rothsay was enlarged this past summer with the addition of a Rohrflote 4' and a Trumpet 8'. The organ is entirely unenclosed on a beam in the balcony above the console. The organ was installed in 1987 and dedicated by Dr. Rod Rothlisberger.

The Johnson Organ at Trinity Lutheran Church in Jamestown now has a four level memory solid state combination action. The work was completed in mid August and consisted of replacing the old electromechanical combination action with a Peterson solid State system along with new stop tablets and piston buttons. The organ, the first totally encased organ by Johnson, was installed in 1976. Dr. Karel Paukert at thaat time played a concert for the student AGO chapter. The organ was voiced in the North German style by voicer, Robert Sperling, who is now head voicer for Dobson Pipe Organ builders of Lake City, Iowa. Organist at Trinity is William Wojnar of Jamestown College.

BOARD MEETING minutes, August 4, 1993. The Red River VAlley Chapter AGO Board met at the home of Margery Possehl, Dean. Those present were: Ruth Berge, Joan Bystol, David Childs, Lloyd Collins, Norman Hansen, Carolyn Hensrud, Lance Johnson, Michael Olson, Craig Proehl, Mercedes Roos, Brad Steen, Mary Tangen.

Steen, Mary Tangen. Committee reports were discussed: Program- The schedule for the year is almost finished, with a few details needing to be fine tuned. 2) Finance- Treasure balance is over \$3,000 which includes more fund drive results; memberships have also come in. One expense was an extensive mailing with address corrections which were costly. 3) Library-RRVAGO materials are stored in the archives at MSU. The library books are in boxes stored at homes of 3 members. It is thought that it might be wise to discontinue the library since materials are missing and are not kept in one place. 4) Membership-Carolyn reported that lists are all updated and being entered into computer files; about 46 memberships have been received. A letter will be sent to those who have not sent their membership renewals including the request to send them in by Aug. 25 to Brad Steen in order to be included in the program handbook. In addition, some people will be called.
5) Handbook-should be out by the Sept. 12 meeting. **Note: The information for the handbook was all prepared by Auyg. and submitted to Mathisons Printers on that date. As of 9-11-93 no work had been done on the book by Mathisons due to an inundation of work orders which are being completed in the order they were received.** 6) Professional concerns-should the chapter have a handbook? We need a program on professional concerns. 7) Newsletter-Mary Tangen remains as editor. One fall issues will have a report of membership and archives. Late memberships received will be listed in forthcoming newsletters. 8) Hymn Festival-Committee has met. Mike Olson urged that we have a hymn festival every year. The board concurred. 9) Long range planning-recommed a survey of membership to gear programs accordingly. Archives-Marlys Herring and Rod Rothlisberger are checking this. Old Business: Grant bills were submitted and justified. New Business: Jennifer Evans has moved of town and a new secretary will be required Lance reported that the Moller Organ Co.

is reopened with 50 employees, and they

have a big backlog of work. Meeting adjourn-

MINUTES...Red River Valley Chapter, Sept.12 1993. The first 1993-94 meeting of the Red River Valley Chapter of the American Guild of Organists took place at the home of member, Dawn Papenfuss, Sunday, Sept. 12.

Minutes of the most recent board meeting were reviewed by Mary Tangen, protem secretary. Marlys Herring will be secretary this year, replacing Jennifer Evans who has moved.

Treasurer Craig Proehl reported a checkbook balance of \$2236.10 on July 1, 1993. Balance on September 11 was \$3002.78. He reported 58 paid members.

Dean Margery Possehl announced some opportunities for exposure: 1) the Guild will have a display at the Hjemkomst Interpretive Center for the New Faculty Reception hosted by the city of Moorhead on Sept.22, 5-7p.m. 2) Judy Sanders and Michael Olson will represent our chapter at Kaleidoscope - the LAAC extravaganza highlighting the arts in Fargo/Moorhead November 7 at the Fargo Theatre.

Our chapter has the opportunity to co-host Dr. Frederick Hohman in a recital in February. Location, date, fee, and joint sponsorship were discussed. First Lutheran and Communiversity are also interested in sharing responsibilities. Mike Olson, Peter Nygaard, George French and Marlys Herring will have further meetings which will include Ann Zavoral of the Communiversity office. A motion made by Mary Tangen and seconded by Peter Nygaard that this committee be empowered to work out the details and sign the necessary contract was passed. Additional concerns were how might we be able to prepare ourselves financially ahead of time so we could comfortably host future recitalists.

It was noted that some of last year's grant money was used to print more stationery and to up-date address corrections.

Next month's meeting is Oct. 17, 4p.m. at Eksjo Lutheran, rural Hawley, with Mike Olson, recitalist.
